

## Black-crowned Night-Heron Nycticorax nycticorax







Black-crowned Night-Herons exhibit a pattern like that of Snowy Egrets, in association with which they often nest. Dramatic shifts in colony locations, with frequent abandonment for a variety of reasons, make it very difficult to discern trends or patterns, but breeding in suburban residential areas was a definite change in behavior between atlas projects. ## Breeding Bird Survey Trend (1966–2019)


